This is much better! The agreement I can just about let pass without comment - just about

- 1) I do note not only is this a 60 month term, but it automatically renews for 60 month terms. We can probably let the 5 years slide rather than the 1 year norm, especially given the nature of this agreement, but I would reach out to see if they would agree to 12 month renewal terms. If the intention is to have new equipment each five years, it would require a new agreement anyway. If we need to renew with the same dishwasher, at least it provides easy out once a year after the initial term is up.
- 2) Same thing about reaching out to Paula Roach to make sure insurance will cover and they approve of agreement (I said Debra Conner before, but Paula handles the contracts).
- 3) I can't pass on an indemnification without at least mentioning it, under #9 of the Terms and Conditions. I don't like indems, but this one is not bad, even understandable, as it's limited to operation of the equipment which they will presumably not be doing.

I'm good with this, pending getting the renewals to 12 months after the first 60.


