With a grant approval, a computer lab would be established and ten desktop computers would be purchased for the purpose of teaching basic word processing including microsoft applications, internet applications, resume writing, use of email, facebook, etc. The time meeded to complete the project would depend on the growing independence of the students. The students would hopefully be equipped with marketable skills and they would be encouraged to teach one another as time progresses. Anyone wanting to learn these job skills would be welcomed to do so in what we hope will be a comfortable and non-threatening environment. Few houses in this community contain computers.

The project would equip participants with marketable skills needed to become a full-time data-entry clerk, word processor, secretary, receptionist and other entry-level office workers. Success and outcomes will be measured by the number of students obtaining full-time office work within 6 months of taking the course.

Word Processing will be offered free of charge until an increased number of individuals show interest in participating in the class. At which time consideration will be given to charging a sustainable fee for the classes taught.

Applicant: The Mary B. Mullen Bible Camp, Inc., formerly a plantation and formerly named "The Mullen Bible Training School," was founded in 1906 for the purpose of educating Aftican Americans who, at that time, had no access to school. After struggling to survive through a series of financial difficulties,

the camp was renamed but was closed periodically. The economically deprived community members strived to reopen the camp, which had been run by absentee, out-of-state administrators, and organized a group of volunteers who elected new officers in 2007 and established a mission statement which was: To upgrade and develop the property into a useful community setting by providing: a retreat-conference center, summer camping facilities, recreational facilities, walking trails, reunion and meeting facilities, and classsrooms for seminars and workshops. The volunteers have since refurbished a dormitory, Chapel, office, dining room, kitchen, storage shed, and basketball court. New construction includes a multipurpose pavilion, storage sheds, restrooms, showers, an outdoor kitchen, basketball court, playground, pump house, and a community garden.

Camp History & Introductory Information

We, the Board and volunteers of The Mary B. Mullen Bible Camp, Inc., are making continuous efforts to upgrade the camp located at 1900 Freemantown Road, Lake Lure, NC. The 54 acre camp, previously a plantation, was founded in 1906 by the Christian Missionary Alliance of New York, with the assistance of Missionaries Ida Ingraham, Mary Mullen, Theodosia Phoenix and Izetta Gamble, for the purpose of educating African American children who, at that time, were unable to obtain regular training in the public school system. Some of the land was donated by African American farmers whose property adjoined the camp property. The camp became inactive periodically down through the years, largely due to lack of funds and by absentee, out-of-state administrators. A new Board was elected in June 2006. The Trustees of St. John Missionary Baptist Church of Lake Lure had served as "overseers" of the property as many of its parishioners were also volunteers of the camp. The camp holds its' own deed and is operated by volunteers of the community with policies established by an elected Board representing the members of local churches and members at large. The IRS approved the camp as a 501(c)3 non-profit organization in 2007.

The camp, formerly named "The Mullen Bible Training School," was a unique setting for the education of African Americans; first as a grade school—then as a high school. The school suffered two major fires (in 1916 then again in 1922) but struggled to remain active until 1943 when it was again temporarily closed due to financial difficulties. The school reopened in 1948 and was also approved as a training facility for adult religious education by the Department of Public Instruction of the State of North Carolina allowing veterans to enroll under the G.I. Bill of Rights. It became idle again from 1952 thru 1966 due to financial difficulties. Subsequently, it was utilized periodically for Bible Study, Vacation Bible School and Christian Training Workshops, etc. conducted by various missionaries, ministers, and evangelists.

The school, renamed The Mary B. Mullen Bible Camp, Inc., was incorporated in 1988. During the 1990's, the camp again experienced many "ups and downs," and was utilized by campers for only two summers. Thereafter, it was neglected and grew up in weeds, underbrush, and trees. It has since been restored mainly by energetic, persistent volunteers of the community who participate in monthly clean-up/maintenance days; and by volunteer mission groups from various churches throughout the entire state.

Our mission is to continue upgrading and developing the entire property into a useful community setting by providing the following: a retreat/conference center, summer camping facilities; recreational facilities, walking trails; picnic facilities, reunion and meeting facilities, a library and a classroom for workshops, and an auditorium for services and programs. The camp also provides tasks for mission groups who desire to volunteer "upgrading" services.

The camp is being designed to accommodate all age groups. We hope to incorporate such flexibility so as to operate from time to time as a summer camp, retreat center, a day or weekend camp, a resident camp, and/or a trip/travel camp. The camp offerings will include activities such as seminars and workshops on health awareness, self-improvement, leadership development, teambuilding, self-empowerment, resume writing, arts/crafts (including quilting), and computer technology. Facilities currently include a softball field, basketball court, horseshoe pits, corn toss games, chair volleyball (for seniors), pickle ball, playground, a huge picnic pavilion, shower house, 12 room dormitory (with 42 bunkbeds), a Chapel, an office, restrooms, storage facility, dining room and kitchen; plus an outdoor kitchen. During the covid pandemic of 2019, a soccer field and a community garden was added. Future projects "being considered" for development include a paint ball area, indoor activity building, a swimming pool, a tennis court, disc golf and a volleyball court. Some of our goals may change based, not only on financial acquisitions, but on community oriented needs and desires.

Camp volunteers and mission groups have assisted with grounds maintenance, repairs and improvements including installation of new windows and doors, roof repairs, handicapped ramps, and painting. Camp activities have included Veteran's Day programs, Family Reunions, Special Anniversary Programs, Community Easter Egg Hunts, Senior Citizen outings, Class Reunions, Back To School campouts (with hayrides), Luncheons, Birthday Parties, etc. Our refurbishing efforts continue to be an humbling and unifying experience for the whole community.

The camp is initially funded by grants, donations and fundraisers. We conduct "million penny jar" donation drives, car washes, yard sales; fish fry's and bake sale fundraisers. Our goals/projects for 2021 include finalizing our website, expanding our new community garden, painting where needed, developing a soccer field, upgrading the outdoor kitchen, repairing an old garage, obtaining new sewing machines, computers and office equipment and developing new walking trails.
