ID 19-1910 A. Community Development Block Grant for Neighborhood Revitalization

Program

CDBG Neighborhood Revitalization Program Attachments:

> Chairman King announced that notification was received from the North Carolina Department of Commerce that Rutherford County had been awarded \$631,667 of Community Development Block Grant funds for the Neighborhood Revitalization Program. Grant funds will be used to assist individual low-to-moderate-income homeowners receive home repairs to improve conditions that pose a serious and immediate threat to the health and welfare of the neighborhood. Assisting with the grant are a number of area nonprofits and public and private housing-related organizations with a common goal of improving housing for all residents of Rutherford County.

> Ms. Nikki Mitchell, staff attorney for Pisgah Legal Services, said the funds awarded will be used for repairs for owner occupied homes. Nineteen homes were selected from across Rutherford County. Most of these homes are valued at less than \$30,000. Repair cost will average \$40,000.

> > Revenue Director Sherry Lavender provided a report on the 2019 reappraisal for the Board. She provided the 2019 new values compared to recent sales which reflected a sales ratio very close to 100%. The taxable value of property along with new construction within Rutherford County rose approximately 11.8478% since the 2012 reappraisal.
